



Call for Entries: Artists for Peace

Project Details:

Canvas Paper and Stone Gallery is pleased to announce a Call for Entries for Artists for Peace. Peace is defined as a state of tranquility or harmony with one's self and others; or more directly silence or stillness. The goal of this Call and the ensuing show is to provide our audience with an exhibition whose intent is to promote harmony, tolerance and peaceful coexistence as dramatized in the words of John Lennon's *Imagine*:

Imagine there's no countries
It isn't hard to do
Nothing to kill or die for
And no religion too
Imagine all the people
Living life in *Peace*...

Artist Eligibility, Deadlines and Important Dates

This Call is open to all artists, for works less than two years old and available for sale.

Submissions deadline: Entries must be received by October 1, 2007

Notification to artists: October 22, 2007

Delivery of Accepted Work: November 16, 2007

Exhibition Opening: Friday, November 30, 2007 from 6 to 9:00 PM

Exhibition Period: Wednesday, November 28 2007 through January 12, 2008

Pick Up/Return Work: January 15 through January 18, 2008

Selection Process

The submitted works should exemplify the above noted characteristics and will be judged on these criteria by the selected expert jurors. Eight to ten artists will be selected for a group show consisting of between 3 and 5 pieces each. We are seeking a wide variety of mediums including two-dimensional and three-dimensional original art, mosaics, sculpture, fabric art, collages, and photography. Works should not exceed 40 inches in height, width or depth. Artists who are selected will enter into a Consignment Agreement with the Gallery for the length of the exhibition.

Submission Requirements

Entry Submissions must include the following components:

- CV / résumé (including exhibit history and education)
- CD containing up to 5 high quality images of recent work and / or images of work that you are proposing to exhibit. Each image must be clearly described, numbered and marked for easy review. The numbers of images must correspond to the list of works provided.
- List of works (including artist name, number corresponding to image provided, title, medium, date, dimensions).
- Artist statement (directly related to the proposed exhibition).
- Completed application form (available to download from website at www.canvaspaperandstone.com/peace/).
- ***Self-addressed, sufficiently stamped envelope for the return of materials if required.***

Specifics for submissions to be accepted in three ways along with additional items listed above:

1. Photographs - at least 5"x7", no bigger than 8.5"x 11"
2. Digital Prints - at least 5"x7", no bigger than 8.5"x 11"
3. CD, PC compatible containing digital images of two or three dimensional images. Digital images must be submitted in 300 dpi resolution.

Responsibilities of Selected Artists

All works must be received by Canvas Paper and Stone Gallery, suitably framed and ready for hanging. Works must be framed under plexiglass. The artist is responsible for adhering to all deadlines and schedules, and for all freight both to and from Canvas Paper and Stone Gallery.

Liability and Insurance

Artists are encouraged to pack and crate works carefully. Neither Canvas Paper and Stone Gallery nor Genesis Art Line, Inc. is responsible for insurance of artwork while in transit, but all works will be insured while in the possession of Canvas Paper and Stone Gallery. Every care will be taken to secure the safety of all works of art. Canvas Paper and Stone Gallery reserves the right to reproduce accepted works to Artists for Peace Exhibition on the Gallery's website and in any advertising or collateral associated with Canvas Paper and Stone Gallery.

Delivery of Art

Each work must have a 3"x5" index card on the lower left back corner containing the following information: Name, Address, Phone, Title, Size, Price.

Return Shipments

Works delivered in person must be picked up between January 15-18, 2007, 1pm-6pm. Works for shipment will be shipped out during the week of January 14th and where possible returned in the same containers as received.

Sales

Sales of accepted entries will be encouraged. All sales made during or resulting from the exhibition will be subject to a 40% commission.
